

June 6–July 28 (Main Gallery)

July 28–August 25 (Member Gallery)

Students from the Open Doors art class—a program for gifted artists age ten to fourteen who may not have the financial means to develop their talent—display their sculpture, paintings, collage, mixed-medium photography, prints, and drawings. Students are referred to the exhibition by their teachers and other professionals, and all pieces entered must have been created within the past two years and never before shown at the Alliance for the Arts galleries. The work is juried, and the top three entries receive cash prizes.

"This show is a chance for Southwest Florida to see fine art from around the state—right in their backyard," says Kathleen Moye, publicity director for the Alliance for the Arts. "It's an exciting collection in which audiences get to see what's new out there in today's vibrant and ever evolving art world. It's definitely worth a visit...maybe two or three!"

One Foot Square

August 3–August 25

During the annual Member Show, artists are allowed to display one piece based on the show theme, which this year is "One Foot Square." Every entry must fit within a 12" x 12" format. Last year's theme was "Branch Out!" and artists submitted pieces that paid homage to the natural beauty of trees; partly to commemorate the damage our landscape sustained during the 2004 and 2005 hurricane seasons.

"The Alliance for the Arts, at its core, is an organization that takes pride in its artist members and their work," says Kathleen Moye, publicity director for the Alliance for the Arts. "So each year [we] dedicate the August show to artist members, and the show presents to them a new challenge or theme. We can't wait to see what will arrive!"

Summer Arts Camp

June 4–August 3

Enhance the lives of your children by sending them to the 19th Annual Summer Arts Camp. Weekly camp themes are all creative in nature, ranging

from musical to theatrical to exploring the great outdoors. A gallery reception and stage performance for parents and friends is held at 2:30 p.m. each Friday. Tuition ranges from \$145 per week (non-members), to \$120 per week (members). Discounts may apply.

June 5–August 3

Children entering grades K-5 will enjoy spending a day (Tuesday through Friday, 9 a.m.-2:30 p.m.) at the BIG ARTS summer camp program. Many great activities will be offered on a rotating schedule, including painting, pottery, music, drama, and movement. Weekly themes may include such topics as "Bridge to BIG ARTS," "Bug-a-licious," and "Where Are the Toys?" Call for tuition fees.

Middle and high school students can participate in the Fine Arts Apprentice Program, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., or noon to 2 p.m. The program includes courses such as Fused Glass and Mosaic, Acting and Improvisation, Pottery and Ceramics, Video Production, and Jewelry & Metalsmith. 



Fine Arts for Kids Camp

June 4–August 3

She explored various painting mediums before realizing that the lens, and all things that affected it, was her natural medium. Reception Friday, August 10, 5-7 p.m. Free and open to the public.
